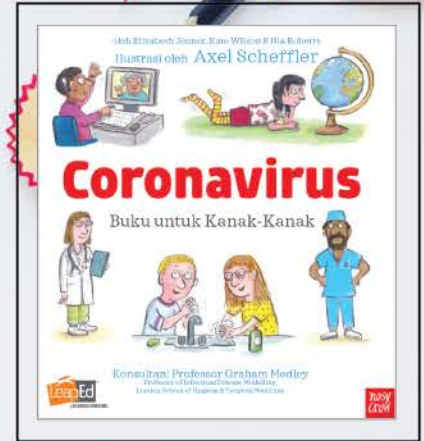

Coronavirus: a book for children



Discussion Questions

- ✓ Talking to children about issues that worry them is not a one-off conversation. It is best to approach the topic by having a few 'bitesize' conversations. It gives your child time to think about what they are talking about, and time for reflection.
- ✓ We recommend using Coronavirus: a book for children in this way. Use it as a book that you keep returning to, rather than reading the whole book in one go.
- ✓ Here are some discussion questions you can use while you read the book.



After you have read the book, talk about:

- 1 What do you already know about COVID-19?
- 2 How does the book make you feel?
- 3 Are you excited about going back to school? (Why?)
- 4 How can you help everyone stay safe?
- 5 What do you think might happen in the future?
- 6 Do you know anyone who has COVID-19? How can we help them?

- ✓ Don't forget that listening is important too. For children to be involved, it is important to show them that you value what they are saying. Remember to smile and show reassurance.
- ✓ Encourage your child to ask you questions too. This is a good opportunity for you to share your values and what is important to your family.
