We need time to enhance and reform education; robust policies take time to draft, let alone implement and monitor effectively.

One thing that remains constant is that teachers know their students best and have the biggest impact on student achievement. However, too much change at the top can leave those on the ground feeling disempowered.

One way we have tried to empower teachers is by implementing Action Research Projects. This enables teachers to use student evidence effectively to improve their practices and lead their own own development of key skills such as problemreflection. innovation solving, and. individual and collective efficacy.

We created a simple 4–Step model to help make the process simple, practical and a little bit fun! While the implementation was not without its challenges, the ownership, conviction and confidence with which the teachers shared their projects was absolutely amazing.

We now have 12 high impact Action Research Projects uploaded onto a platform called Middle Leaders Network (https://www.midlen.org/). The publishing of these projects on MidLEN allows teachers to access their own Google sites that serve as their e-portfolio, in line with MoE Google's e-learning initiative – it also, of course, allows all teachers and middle leaders accessing the platforms to view the projects.
