We must look beyond the digital connection and look at other lost connections that are caused by school closures.



Sadly, Malaysian children already felt disconnected at School. In 2018, the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA), an international benchmark for student data, reported these sobering statistics.



Malaysian children fear failure more than the PISA average.



Malaysian children believe less in their own ability than the PISA average.



Malaysian children report feeling sad more often than the PISA average.



Malaysian children report being bullied more than the PISA average.




