Since 2010, LeapEd has evolved from a single flagship initiative into a dynamic portfolio of more than 40 impactful programmes and projects, along with more than 600 training modules developed. Each initiative-whether rooted in literacy, leadership, digital learning, mental health, or inclusivity-reflects our belief that real transformation happens when we respond to the changing needs of schools, students, and society.

This evolution tells the story of how LeapEd continuously listens, adapts, and leads: from Trust Schools Programme to Sekolah Anak Malaysia, from coaching academies to community-rooted innovations. The diversity of our work demonstrates the power of education when guided by purpose, evidence, and empathy.



Congratulations to LeapEd as it turns 15. As we reflect, it is with some curiosity that we wonder why the nation's sovereign investment fund and its stewards would even consider, let alone actually go ahead with, investing substantial sums and management time into the public education sector. Public education is indeed not a conventional investment for a sovereign wealth fund. That we did, and at scale, is in itself a cause for gratitude and celebration - Alhamdulillah.

The Sekolah Amanah Trust Schools Programme and its twin institutions, Yayasan AMIR and LeapEd, were born out of a belief that education is the most powerful long-term lever in national development. It was a natural evolution and manifestation of the new Khazanah that emerged in 2004, with a mandate to deliver what we called Building True Value - a triple-key mandate to deliver not just positive financial and economic outcomes, but also to create societal value, particularly by uplifting the nation's human capital.

Among other things, we learned that education is cumulative - early achievements compound, just as early neglect can entrench disadvantage. Many of us knew, in deeply personal terms, that education is the greatest leveller of all. Khazanah's early corporate responsibility efforts focused on human capital and knowledge development, including scholarships.

We also deliberately rejected various tempting and financially lucrative proposals to invest in private education, recognising that such ventures would only further widen inequality. Instead, we took a bold step into public education through a public-private partnership (PPP) approach - blending private sector-style management and funding with public interest, universal access, and the national curriculum. We studied models such as the US Charter School movement and eventually co-designed what became the Trust Schools Programme, with LeapEd as its implementation partner.



While LeapEd's interventions - including TSP- have now touched over 1,800 schools (approximately 18% of government schools), the intention was never to "boil the ocean." It was always about creating a positive demonstration effect - a kind of transformation acupuncture. Fifteen years on, Alhamdulillah, it has had an impact. More importantly, its relative longevity - in a sector often plagued by frequent change and policy flip-flops - affirms its potential as a lasting force for good.

LeapEd at 15 embodies the dream of its founders: to be a powerful agent of change in public education, delivering what may well be the highest ROI (Return on Investment) of all.

May LeapEd and its partners continue to realise this, InsyaAllah.

From the moment I came on board as a nominee of Khazanah Nasional, I realised that LeapEd was special. Here was a group of individuals working towards what I have always believed education should be - an initiative to empower student learning where teaching was a tool to support learning, and not the other way round.

I experienced many unforgettable moments. One that really stands out for me happened on a visit to our Trust Schools in the Kuching area. We visited a charming but raw school which was new to our scheme, SK Tanjung Tuang, followed immediately by a visit to a small school which we had worked with for a few years, SK Tabuan. The latter was light years ahead in its nurturing of the students' learning journey. The difference was staggering, and we, LeapEd, were responsible for the change (and the prawns were so tasty too - lol).

It dawned on me that we were now in a position of power to really make a difference to Malaysian education. I was inspired by this more than any other experience I have had in Malaysia. And this leads on seamlessly to my hopes and dreams for the future - that the whole nation should by now be on this pathway, led by our Ministry of Education. I fear this may not be realised in my lifetime.

My thanks to all those wonderful, inspiring colleagues I worked with - Tan Sri Zul (Chair), Zaida, Shahnaz, Tzu Anne, Ken Shen, Dato' Shukri, Katina Tan, John Chacko, Nina, Zul, Conrad, and many, many more.

Berani to Make a Difference

I joined Khazanah in 2007 and was part of a pivotal brainstorming session on the role Khazanah should play in shaping Malaysia's future. If we were simply thinking like a private equity fund, the natural move would have been to invest in mid-tier, medium-cost tertiary education - producing graduates at scale. But if we were genuinely invested in the long-term future of Malaysia's talent pool, then our efforts needed to start much earlier - in the K–12 space, within public schools. After all, this was the longest runway available to shape the next generation.

I remember hearing - rather than witnessing - the incredible effort it took to land on what became the Trust School Project. The discussions, the syndication, the push for alignment... all of it culminated in a bold decision: to establish LeapEd as the implementation arm, structured as a commercial entity, and Yayasan AMIR as its non-profit champion for public education transformation.

I became directly involved when I stepped into the role of Executive Director of Investments and later joined LeapEd's Board around 2014. That's when the work became personal.

Visiting the early Trust Schools always left a deep impression on me. The students - even the younger ones - carried themselves with confidence, proud of their classrooms and the work displayed on their walls. The teachers were just as energised. It was hard to believe these were public schools; the classroom atmosphere resembled that of international institutions. At Sekolah Menengah Sains Kuching, one of the first ten Trust Schools, I saw a student-led initiative called "Who Wants to be a Millionaire" - a millionaire of words. I remember thinking, Wow - we never had anything like that in school.

What makes LeapEd different is not just its intelligent minds - many organisations have that. It is the heart, the genuine care, and the deep commitment to making a difference that sets LeapEd apart. They carried the mission not as a job, but as a purpose.

Being part of this journey taught me that doing good is not always easy. It is not always appreciated. But if you believe in the cause, you must persevere. Surround yourself with like-minded allies, be willing to tweak the method - but never lose sight of the goal.

My dream for LeapEd is one that still burns bright: that it will grow into an international education powerhouse from Malaysia - a model of bold, value-driven transformation that others can learn from.

Where Passion Meets Discipline

My name is Tzu Anne, and I had the privilege of serving as the Overseeing Director from Khazanah for LeapEd Services from mid-2011 to early 2021. I was there when LeapEd was still a start-up - a wholly owned entity of Khazanah, created specifically to implement the Yayasan AMIR Trust Schools Project. It was a bold vision born from Khazanah's deep commitment to education transformation in Malaysia.

From the company's early days to its eventual independence, I had the honour of witnessing and supporting LeapEd's growth - from infancy to adulthood. Helping to shape its direction, identity, and purpose during those formative years remains one of the most meaningful chapters of my career.

Of all the moments I shared with the LeapEd team, one memory still makes me smile - the day I found myself walking down all 51 floors of Menara Telekom for a fire drill. Only LeapEd has ever managed to get me to do that. Thank you.

But what truly sets LeapEd apart, and why it continues to stand strong, is its unique blend of corporate discipline and heartfelt passion for education. In many organisations, these two forces exist in parallel, or even in tension - metrics versus meaning, structure versus soul. But LeapEd managed to merge both worlds. Its planning, budgeting, KPIs, documentation - all grounded in corporate rigour - were matched by an undeniable love for learning, teaching, and transformation. That powerful fusion came to life most clearly in the Trust Schools Programme, where change was driven not just by policy but by people - leaders, teachers, students, parents, and the broader community.



Personally, my journey with LeapEd taught me a great deal about human capital development. Whether working with students, teachers, or leaders, it was rewarding - but also challenging. People are wonderfully unpredictable, and that unpredictability is what makes them different from all other mammals. You can nurture and guide, but no two individuals will ever respond the same way. And therein lies both the frustration and the beauty.

My hope for LeapEd is that it continues redefining what a school can be, and what it means to be a truly holistic student. The challenges ahead will be unlike anything we have faced - but I trust LeapEd's tenacity, and its ability to evolve, will carry it forward into the next 15 years and beyond.

In LeapEd, We Trust

I am not new to LeapEd - in fact, it feels like I have known them for years. They are like family to me. Currently, I serve as the District Education Officer for Petaling Utama in Selangor, but my journey with LeapEd began much earlier, in 2017, when I was the Principal of a Trust School. Since then, I have grown tremendously as a leader, guided by many experienced and dedicated educators from the LeapEd team.

The experience of being a school leader within the Trust School Programme was truly transformational. I learned how to be an instructional leader - from conducting classroom observations to managing school finances. Processes like the Learning Walk taught me that effective leadership begins with strong planning. Every detail - from document preparation to coordinating schedules for the leadership and middle leaders - had to be well thought out. Similarly, the preparation of data for Mid-Year Reviews and Year-End Reviews under LeapEd's guidance became some of the most valuable professional memories I carry with me.

LeapEd also taught me to view performance evaluation differently. When assessing my senior leaders, I learned to do so objectively, guided by clear rubrics in the Performance Management System. We would sit together and reflect openly - not to judge, but to grow and achieve shared goals.

What makes LeapEd so special is not just their technical excellence. It is the values they embody. The team is dedicated, strategic, grounded, and deeply human. They coach with empathy, embrace diverse perspectives, and always greet you with a smile - even in the face of challenges.



My time with LeapEd has shaped me into a more organised and data-driven leader. These skills serve me well today as a district officer, especially in a high-performing district like Petaling Utama, where we constantly review data to maintain our standards. I now mentor and coach other officers, using what I learned from LeapEd - how to think strategically, solve problems from multiple angles, and adapt to ever-changing environments.

Meeting people from different cultures and systems through LeapEd has also made me more open-minded and agile in managing change. It was never just about programmes - it was about transforming people.

My hope is that LeapEd will continue to serve the nation by producing knowledgeable, values-driven teachers who guide students into becoming better citizens. I hope LeapEd remains true to its passion, its patience, and its ability to embrace differences - for these are the qualities that make them who they are.

Empowering Transformation

I'm an educator and school leader who has been deeply involved with LeapEd's initiatives since 2015, when the Trust Schools Programme was first introduced at SMK Muara Tuang. I had the honour of serving as our school's Trust School Programme Coordinator, and today, I continue my journey as a Senior Leadership Team member, overseeing co-curricular programmes.

Among the many moments I've experienced with LeapEd, one in particular stands out — a deep-dive reflection session with our school's leadership team. We were guided to map our journey using the PDCA cycle (Plan-Do-Check-Act), and it became a moment of clarity. For the first time, we saw our struggles, growth, and milestones laid out in front of us - not just as a document, but as a living story of transformation. That session reminded us that our work was not just about plans or data. It was about people, passion, and purpose. It was about the beautiful journey that was the Trust Schools Programme.

What makes LeapEd truly different is that it is more than an organisation - it is a movement. There's a culture of collaboration, empowerment, and reflection that runs deep in everything they do. LeapEd doesn't merely deliver workshops or frameworks - they walk alongside us, as partners and fellow learners, in this collective journey of change.

Personally, LeapEd has helped me embrace the power of emotional intelligence in leadership. I've learned to lead with empathy and intention. Professionally, I have grown from a middle leader into a reflective and empowered senior leader, one who values sustainable change and believes in the strength of distributed leadership. I no longer see leadership as top-down but as a shared responsibility to uplift and inspire.



Looking forward, my hope is that LeapEd continues to be the heartbeat of educational reform in Malaysia - expanding its reach, innovating with courage, and nurturing leaders who do more than teach. Leaders who transform. Leaders who inspire.

But long before I stepped into the world of academia, my journey was shaped by a very special experience one that began at SMK Cochrane, Kuala Lumpur, when our school joined the Trust Schools Programme in 2016.

The transformation was real. The programme encouraged both students and teachers to step beyond our comfort zones, to experiment with new ways of learning and teaching. While the journey had its challenges, the growth we experienced - in confidence, leadership, communication, and community spirit - was invaluable.

Because of the platform and support provided by the programme, I had the incredible opportunity to represent SMK Cochrane at district, state, and even international levels. As part of our innovation team, we competed in the International Invention, Innovation & Technology Exhibition (ITEX) under the Malaysian Young Inventor Exhibition (MYIE) in 2018 and 2019, where we proudly brought home bronze and silver awards. Beyond the accolades, we also had the chance to present our work in numerous exhibitions - something I never imagined doing in secondary school.

Two events remain particularly close to my heart: the 'Trust School Social Challenge (YA Cup)' in 2018 and the 'Bengkel Penulisan Kreatif bersama Sasterawan Negara' in 2019. These opportunities - organised by Yayasan AMIR - were more than just school activities. They were eye-opening, deeply enriching experiences that sparked inspiration, built friendships, and expanded our view of what learning could be.

Would I feel lost in this new environment? But from the moment I stepped in, all those worries began to fade.

SAM felt safe and comfortable from the start. The way we learn is different - more open, more collaborative, and filled with encouragement from both teachers and fellow students. I quickly felt that I belonged.

One of the most special moments in my journey was being chosen as the Sports Committee Champion for the Student Voice Group (SVG). This role helped me step out of my comfort zone. I had to lead discussions, collaborate with others to plan school activities, and think critically about how to promote wellness and inclusivity. That experience gave me a sense of responsibility and boosted my confidence in ways I never expected.

From my time at SAM, I have learned that I can be both a leader and a team player. I discovered new strengths in myself, like creativity and the ability to listen to others with empathy. I also developed a deeper appreciation for the perspectives of my classmates and teachers. Learning became something meaningful - not just about books and tests, but about connection and growth.

Quietly Powerful

I had the privilege of spending five transformative years at LeapEd. I joined as a Programme Designer and eventually stepped into the role of Head of Education and Learning. Over the years, I worked on a wide range of initiatives, but the part of my journey I hold most dear was helping to embed health promotion, child protection, and safeguarding into LeapEd's DNA - not just as compliance, but as a genuine care for students and school communities.

One standout moment came during a strategic planning workshop for IPGM in Port Dickson, just after the lockdown. I was part of a powerhouse team of women and had the opportunity to lead a session on having difficult conversations. Over lunch, a senior deputy director shared her reflections on women in leadership, and that conversation stuck with me. She reminded me that influence does not always require a title - that quiet, consistent action can spark real, lasting change.

Another moment that has stayed with me was a focus group with Form 5 students in Sarawak. We spoke about mental health, and their honesty took my breath away. These young people shared their experiences with clarity, confidence, and insight. They reminded me that youth often make wise decisions in their best interest - even when those choices do not always align with adult expectations.

What makes LeapEd different is not perfection - it is its persistence. This is an organisation that commits to its values, even when the path is unclear. There is a constant thread of innovation, integrity, and a sincere desire to do the right thing - especially when it is hard. I was proud to contribute to LeapEd's staff wellbeing efforts and to stand beside colleagues who were deeply mission-driven.



Being part of LeapEd also transformed how I saw Malaysia. It deepened my understanding of the country's diversity and complexity, and it taught me how to listen - really listen - with empathy. I was welcomed into spaces I might never have entered otherwise, and through those connections, I saw how rich and remarkable this country truly is.

I joined LeapEd at a crossroads in my life, unsure of my next steps. What I found was an environment that gave me room to grow, test bold ideas, and take on challenges that stretched me far beyond my comfort zone. I worked with universities, helped write a children's book, collaborated with UNICEF, trained teachers and leaders, pitched to funders, and contributed to research. In the process, LeapEd rebuilt not just my CV - but my confidence and my perspective.

As LeapEd moves into its next 15 years, my hope is simple: keep going. Keep making the small, deliberate steps that lead to meaningful change. True transformation is rarely loud or immediate - but it is steady, inclusive, and built with everyone on board. After all, every child deserves a great future.


